Topic/Unit Summary	Characterisation	
	There are two common approaches to characterisation. An actor can begin with the internal life and let the physicality build from that, OR an actor can start with the external, physical work and gradually fill this with the rich internal choices.	
	Seasoned actor, Anthony Gooley, will show students how these ideas are not mutually exclusive.	
	In this workshop, Anthony teaches drama students how to build character using both approaches simultaneously, meeting in the middle to form a fully-realised, nuanced character.
